





Minnesota Dental Foundation



For a number of years, I have donated turnings to the Minnesota Dental Foundation for the Silent Auction at its Fundraising Gala. The MN Dental Foundation has several goals:

- Eliminate unmet dental needs in Minnesota
- •Help eliminate underserved dental care areas in the state
- Provide dental services to those most in need

The main programs are:

- The DDS (Donated Dental Services) program provides comprehensive dental care to those who are disabled or who are elderly or medically fragile and cannot afford the needed dental care. It also provides services to veterans.
- Give Kids A Smile over 100 dentists treating over 1000 children in a single day. Since the program's inception in Minnesota in 2003, 84,000 children have received \$26.4 million worth of free dentistry provided by 35,450 volunteers.
- •Mission of Mercy in 6 events over 10,000 patients, over \$6 million of dentistry
- Dental Lifeline Network (DLN) provides services to veterans.
- •The Minnesota's Heroes Orthodontic Program provides orthodontic care to children and spouses of Gold Star Families (families who have lost a family member while serving our country since 9/11)

The director of the Silent Auction says the bowls are popular and he will probably only use about a third of these this year to drive the prices up in the bidding.



Next Meeting

August 3rd, 2024 MWA Monthly Meeting

Demo starts at 10:00 am Zoom is live at 9:30 am Doors open at 9:00 am After a month's break, we will meet and have professional turner, Michael Kehs, as our demonstrator. He will be sharing his knowledge and insight on inside-out turning.

Michael describes his demo as:

Inside-out Turning

This demo will stretch your imagination, in that I will show how to make four pieces of wood into a bat, flower, shark, or other simple drawing into a turned object. An inside-out turning is a spindle turning with both ends left square, which is then cut or separated into four equal pieces lengthwise. The four outside corners are rotated inward, resulting in four "windows" or silhouettes. The turned shape of the spindle dictates the shape of the silhouette and will produce a symmetrical pattern. An asymmetrical silhouette requires two different, but matched turnings.

Michael will be holding a class after the meeting and again on Sunday the 4th of August.

We need heavy duty plastic jugs for dispensing sealer. If you have any gallon containers, we could sure use them. It would be best if you could bring your empty containers to be filled.


The club now has a chip card reader so you can pay Charlie by credit card or cash.
