#### A Message from Mark Debe, Outgoing MWA Treasurer - A Look at MWA's Changes and Financial Growth over the Past 10 years

After 9 years and 7 months as the MWA treasurer, I am delighted to "introduce" MWA member John Hehre as my replacement. (Introduce is in quotations for those readers who may have missed the election results of our November membership meeting.) John has extensive experience both founding and serving on the boards of numerous non-profit organizations, including the position of Treasurer, following degrees in engineering and business management. A perfect skill set and preparation for this volunteer job, I would say.

The reason for the odd number of months I've been in this position, is that I was appointed by Neil Robinette, MWA president at the time, in mid-term of my predecessor, who moved out of the area for his job. He exported to me a copy of the Quicken software he had initiated two years earlier, for tracking MWA financials, gave me a box of historical club papers and receipts, and wished me luck. I had joined MWA just 7 months earlier and obtained my first lathe 6 months earlier, so I had a lot to learn about the Club's financial transactions as well as its craft of wood turning. To say I benefited from the help of the four presidents, Neil, Rick Auge, Lee Luebke, Charlie Prokop and key long-term members of the MWA board of directors Janese Evans, Linda Ferber, and Ken Crea, is a significant understatement.

Over this 10-year period, the MWA has experienced a number of significant changes and improvements in serving its members, including: moving from donated space at the Roseville Salvation Army building to the great facilities we have now at Houck Machine Co.; investing over \$54,000 in lathes, tools, website capabilities and AV equipment for better meeting, hands-on workshop classes and general membership experiences; getting 501c.3 registration; making it through the pandemic and adopting zoom capabilities and live streaming of our membership meetings and professional demonstrations. I would add also, increased activity in multiple MWA splinter-groups around the metro area, and most recently, Charlie's push to get volunteer teams identified and resourced to more effectively fulfill the club activities.

As for the treasurer's function, from my biased perspective, there is now increased value in having developed and maintained a detailed archival compilation which documents every single transaction between the treasurer and any member, usually another MWA board member, our suppliers, other NPO's, landlords and so forth. Not only because it is a primary mechanism for achieving total transparency against mistakes, and heaven forbid, fraud, but it also enables data-mining for guiding the board on the major financial decisions it has to make. So it's interesting to take a look back and summarize from a financial perspective a few major take-aways from the past 10 years of Club activities.

Starting from scratch, I decided that the overall most important job responsibility of the Treasurer is to provide 100% transparency of all transactional dealings, as completely and accurately as possible, and in such a manner as to completely obviate the possibility of any fraudulent handling of the organization's funds, by any member, especially the treasurer, ever. From a "job" requirement perspective, that translated over the period of 6/1/2014 through 12/30/2023 to mean entering into the Quicken software and tracking a total of 4,724 monetary transactions including 915 Cash Account, 716 Checking Account, and 3029 PayPal account transactions; spending hours sometimes to find errors I made in entering and making sure the balances with bank and PayPal statements agreed to the penny. Writing 1080 checks and receipts, 82 monthly and quarterly reports to the board, composed of 944 pages showing every receipt written for cash received, invoice paid, bank deposit made; and Quicken transaction summaries of every one of the three accounts monitored: cash in/out, PayPal transfer to the bank account, and finally the bottom-line, every monthly Bank statement.

Most important of course, is what all those member and board transactions represented and brought to the growth and health of the MWA over the past nearly 10 years, thanks to you the membership and the substantial guidance of the MWA boards and the leadership of their presidents. Here is a partial list:

#### MWA Income Totals for 6/1/14 - 12/30/23

(mainly from membership contributed dues, donations and such)

• Checking, PayPal and Cash account income totals for the period = \$227,718

#### MWA Spending by Categories for 6/1/14 – 12/30/23

(these are the major membership benefits your membership-contributed income bought)

- 41 Professional Demo's (just from 10/3/16 to present) = \$51,503.
- Net increase of liquid assets (cash in the bank) over the period: from \$21,246 to \$43,493.
- Club Lathes and Tool purchases (for classes and meeting demonstrations) = \$21,678.
- Website Expenses (since 7/17/2015) = \$19,376.
- Donations made by MWA (to other NPO's, fulfilling our mission) = \$13,597.
- Monthly meeting demo expenses including AV equipment = \$12,575.
- Rent to Houck Machine Co. (from 6/25/22, currently at \$900/month) = \$9,400.
- Tool raffle purchase's = \$8,711.
- Wood sealer purchases = \$7,964.
- Insurance: The Hartford = \$5,896.
- General meeting refreshments, mainly donuts = \$4,009.
- Office supplies (lots of subcategories here), postage = \$3,474.
- Meeting facility upkeep and code compliance = \$2,371.
- Gift cards and membership packets = \$2,201.
- And so forth.

I hope you agree that the MWA board has done a yeoman's (and yeoladie's) job in both generating funds and utilizing them effectively to meet the mission statement of the MWA and the membership expectations, while striving still to improve the latter. They are a dedicated bunch of folks who really take their service to the membership seriously, in particular from my observations, the amazing Janese Evans and Linda Ferber.

I am most grateful to all those who helped me over the years, in particular the adhoc financial team help of Paul Laes and Jeff Luedloff, membership director Ken Crea, Jeff Koltveit of Woodcraft, and the four presidents I served with. I doubt John Hehre or his financial team will require the help I did, but it is definitely there if they do. Now, I no longer have being treasurer as an excuse for not woodturning enough.

Mike Hunter has given classes on the "Richard Raffan" style box over the years. The Raffan box is a straight forward, pleasing form developed from a single piece of wood.







Al Fletcher and Lee Tourtelotte brought samples of their bowls from a board. Lee described the originating technique of Michael Mode and Lee's taking his brief class a few years back in Michael Mode's rural Vermont shop. Al described the special fixture he has made for his banjo that allows for cutting the rings with both a movable angle and fixed angle parting tool, which allows cutting "full" rings eliminating cutting half rings and the need to glue the half rings back together.



# Erratum: November Newsletter

### **Editor's Notes**






