






Red oak crotch bowl 9" diameter. Note four piths, not just three.






Spalted birch platter 11" diameter. I took the last cut I shouldn't have and made a 1/2" hole in the center. The grain pattern helps hide the repair.

I know you'll enjoy this "Covid Parody" of Billy Joel's famous song, The Longest Time. You'll be humming it all day.









Diagram of cutting log



Diagrams of varying ratio of diameter & length of blank




Bottom feeder with secondary bevel

Start sanding. Bob does not sand natural edge bowls with the lathe running.




Set the depth of the bowl with drill before starting the inside
