



This cookie jar is 9" high and 7" in diameter. It's made of maple, alder, and walnut with a polished stone embedded in the knob on the lid; finished with Howard's Butcher Block Conditioner.



Doyle Carroll (cont'd)



These pieces incorporate celtic rings. The smaller one is a pencil holder, 4.5" tall and 2.75" in diameter, made of walnut and alder. The taller one is a vase, 8" tall and 3.75" in diameter, made of walnut, alder and maple. Both are finished with 1 coat of sanding sealer, 2 coats of EEE Ultra-Shine and 3 coats of Myland's Friction Polish.

> 6 ½ " x2 ½". 2 coats Osmo polyx oil finish






