
March Monthly Challenge 24 spindles 9 bases and top sets 8 or 9 complete wig stands

April Demonstration "Total Control"

Michael Mocho




Demonstrator Michael Mocho gave a rapid-fire demonstration that packed a very large number of tips and techniques into his program His ability to speedily and carefully turn even the most delicate pieces exemplified a "total control" type turning to which all woodturners can aspire

Michael's mounting between centers technique was fast and accurate








One of Michael's main topics was "chatter turning" meaning that either the wood or the tool is vibrating. The vibration causes the tool edge to touch the wood intermittently and to cut at those points. He showed how good control of the tool can result in an extremely wide variation of very interesting patterns.

THE Splinters



We had an inspirational and informative visit to Shelley Beaumont's studio at Northrup King. Her healing mosaics inspired our next splinter group project.

In the same gallery #445 is glass artist Mary Schwartz. We were welcomed into her studio to watch bead making in action. Mary has donated over 1,000 beads to BOC which was very cool and gave us a common interest.

Viewing the display in their studio gave us understanding of the symbols and process Shelly Beaumont uses in creating her healing artwork. Subjective symbolism is a attribute she uses in her healing artwork. Several of the pieces included a tag that defined the symbolism of materials, their beauty and ability to heal and bring harmony to the body and soul.





THE Splinters

After our visit we had a discussion to explore the possibility of THE Splinters creating a group project to consider what healing art means to us and how it can be incorporated into our work. We agreed to explore this for our group challenge.

- We will each make a piece or two that will be displayed in a long narrow vessel
 - Include a tag that describes its healing symbolism or general vibe.
 - This can be rolled up and inside vessel or displayed outside vessel
 - The vessel is 3" wide by 21" long
 - It is a medium colored wood (purchased from Pier One)
- Our piece should be able to sit in the vessel, be creative and allow us to challenge ourselves to make something in a new direction.
- **Time frame:** please bring your completed work to the **May chapter meeting** where we will display them in the vessel in the instant gallery.
 - Explore and be fearless
 - Color
 - Textures
 - Beads and/or metals
 - Shape and beauty of the wood
 - Meaningful Symbols of healing that are personal to you
 - Is the healing for the viewer or the maker or both

SE Metro March



He's written for The Wall Street Journal, Men's Health, Smithsonian, The Minneapolis Star Tribune, Mother Earth News, Fine Homebuilding and lots and lots of other magazines. In the last 15 years he's written seven books including the award-winning "A Splintered History of Wood," selected by NPR as one of the best books for gift giving. He's appeared on NBC's TODAY SHOW, Modern Marvels, HGTV, the CBS Early Show, and dozens of other radio and television programs. His presentation was thoroughly enjoyed by those attending.






Community Service
